Signature Program Accomplishments



Academic Success

Volunteers helped students improve their academic performance by learning important letter writing skills (pen pals) and helping students improve readings skills (reading tutors).

- 345 volunteers served in education-based assignments
- 4,435 hours were served being matched one-on-one or in small groups with 464 elementary/middle school students as pen pals or reading tutors
- 95% of students showed improved academic engagement or social-emotional skills

Disaster Services, Public Health, and Safety

Keeping our communities safe and prepared

RSVP Volunteer Management for Disasters/Emergencies

Disaster 101 Training

RSVP staff, along with area professionals from Emergency Management, Story County Sheriff's Office, and Story County Public Health, shared about the critical role volunteers play in a local disaster/emergency.

• Attended by 25 volunteers, this event was a refresher for volunteers who have served or been trained in the past and an introduction for new volunteers interested in learning about making a difference in times of crisis.

PrepWise

New Partnership launched in June, 2024! PrepWise is a University of Iowa program dedicated to preparing older adults for disasters. PrepWise helps individuals develop disaster management plans before a disaster or emergency situation happens, with an emphasis on helping older adults be prepared to shelter in place for three days.

• 4 volunteers trained to present this information to residents in Central Iowa (30 participants at kick off presentation in June, 2024)

Fraud Fighters

The Iowa Department of Insurance & Financial Services partners with RSVP to inform the public about fraud and scams. They train RSVP volunteers to present fraud prevention information to groups in their community.

- 5 volunteers conducted 10 Fraud Fighter presentations
- 239 retirees were provided with fraud prevention tips and learned how to avoid scams

Health, Wellness, and Independent Living

Helping citizens stay healthy and maintain control of their well-being

RSVP Transportation Program

Primary purpose: Providing Story County's older adults with safe and reliable transportation to and from medical appointments and other essential services

- 39 volunteers served 1,723 hours providing rides for 72 clients
- 20,565 miles were driven, taking Story County residents to and from needed services
- 100% of surveyed riders reported an increased capacity to maintain their independence and overall well-being as a result of the program



BASE Senior Fitness

Free senior fitness exercise program helping older adults improve Balance, Agility, Strength, and Endurance

- 22 volunteers served 1,343 hours leading fitness classes for 310 participants in Hamilton & Webster Counties
- 97% of surveyed participants reported improved overall health as a result of BASE classes

Food Security Assignments

RSVP Grocery Delivery Program

- 243 grocery deliveries made to homebound individuals
- 18 volunteers served 284 hours and drove 3,790 miles delivering groceries

Other Food Security Assignments

- **42 volunteers served 2,440 hours** serving hot meals, helping in food pantries and with food rescue programs
- 81 volunteers served 2,275 hours delivering meals and commodity food boxes to individuals and families





Capacity Building

Providing diverse volunteer recruitment and placement support that supplements or enhances the services of public, non-profit, and health care agencies (not reflected in other sections of this report)

Environmental Stewardship

• 21 RSVP volunteers served 474 hours at conservation centers, trail and park maintenance, garden spaces, and Reiman Gardens

Other Education

• **60 RSVP volunteers served 1,944 hours** at libraries, museums, ISU Extension, community programs, school-based activities, and adult literacy programs

Housing / Financial Stability

• 14 RSVP volunteers served 1,135 hours as representative payees/bill payers, and at agencies meeting housing and financial needs

Medical

 49 RSVP volunteers served 3,333 hours at local medical/senior care facilities, blood drives, substance abuse prevention and support, and hospice

Other Public, Non-Profit Support

 42 RSVP volunteers served 5,591 hours at thrift stores, clerical, special events/ projects, historical societies, senior service agencies

ACCESS (ASSAULT CARE CENTER EXTENDING SUPPORT & SERVICES) – Ames

Office Volunteer: (Monday through Friday 9:00 AM - 5:00 PM, 4-hour shifts.) Answering phones and other admin tasks.

BERTHA BARTLETT PUBLIC LIBRARY – Story City

After-School Program: (Wednesdays 1:45 PM – 4:00 PM.) Monitor kids K-4th grade while they participate in the program.

Library Assistant: (Monday through Friday 10:00 AM – 2:00 PM.) Assist with general library duties.

Technology Assistant: (Monday through Friday 10:00 AM – 2:00 PM.) Assist patrons with technology difficulties.

BETHANY LIFE – Story City

Front Desk Greeter (212 Lafayette Ave): (Monday through Friday 10:00 AM - 2:00 PM.) The volunteer will greet visitors at the front door of the Households of Bethany and assist them where they need to go. Training is required.

Affordables Thrift Store (630 Penn Ave): (Monday through Friday 9:00 AM – 1:00 PM or 1:00 PM – 5:00 PM, Saturdays 8:30 AM – 2:00 PM or 12:00 PM – 3:30 PM.) Volunteers will sort, price, clean, and stock donated merchandise.

CARE INITIATIVES HOSPICE – Story & Marshall County

Friendly Visitors: (Days and times determined by the volunteer and client.) Volunteers will offer a variety of support for Hospice clients such as reading, playing music, playing games, or simple listening. Training is provided.

CENTRAL IOWA RSVP – Story County

Transportation Program: Provide occasional rides to those in need of transportation to medical appointments and essential services. Ames, Story City, and Nevada drivers are needed, will use personal vehicle for rides.

CITY OF AMES – Ames

Kiosk Attendant (City Hall): (Monday through Friday 8:00 AM - 12:00 PM or 1:00 PM - 5:00 PM.) Answer the phone and direct people in City Hall. Must work independently and navigate computer and phone (training provided.)

CITY OF AMES HISTORY MUSEUM - Ames

Welcome Desk Attendant: (Various weekday shirts.) Greet visitors, explain museum layout, tell visitors about exhibits.

Gallery Attendant: (Various weekday shifts.) Monitor exhibit spaces, reset interactive exhibits, answer questions.

GOOD NEIGHBOR EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE - Ames

Clerical support: (Monday, Tuesday, & Thursday 1:00 PM – 4:00 PM.) Assist at the reception area, answer phones, assess client needs, and distribute vouchers with a cheerful attitude and ability to respect confidentiality.

HEARTLAND OF STORY COUNTY – Story County

Volunteer Drivers: (Monday through Friday 10:00 AM – 1:00 PM.) Volunteers are needed to deliver a hot lunch to seniors' homes in Story County. Pick up the meals at Mary Greeley and deliver to the clients listed on the route.

HOUSE OF COMPASSION – Marshalltown

Miscellaneous Support: Volunteer needs include sorting donations and assisting clients at the **Supply Closet**, assisting with **cooking and serving meals**, and processing, moving, stocking, and cataloging **Donations**.

ISU EXTENSION & OUTREACH – Marshalltown

Miscellaneous Support: Volunteers needed for clerical duties when staff is away and re-stock Free Little Food Pantries.

Commodity Box Delivery: (One day/month between 9:00 – 4:00.) Deliver boxes to homes in NE Ames/Roland/Story City.

Gift Shop: (Various shifts available.) Assist guests with gift selection, cashiering, and wrapping gifts.

ICCU Information Desk: (Tuesdays 9:00 AM – 12:00 PM & Fridays 3:00 PM – 6:00 PM.) Provide directions to patient rooms and other areas, serve as a check point for patient visits, and answer questions.

Meals on Wheels Support: (Monday – Friday 11:00 AM - 12:30 PM.) Provide support to volunteer drivers, clean and organize delivery bags, collect and file route sheets, occasional meal delivery if driver shift is open.

Pet Therapy: (Flexible days, 3:00 PM shift.) Seeking volunteers with a dog certified through Therapy Dogs International to visit patients on the Physical Rehab unit, along with a designated staff person.

MICA (MID IOWA COMMUNITY ACTION) - Ames

Food Pantry Assistants: (Monday, Wednesday, and Friday 9:00 AM – 4:00 PM, 2 hour shifts.) Several opportunities, like **Clerical** – checking individuals in, **Stocking** pantry shelves and compiling orders, and **Contactless Delivery Driver**.

Meal Preparation, Packing, Delivery, and Clean Up: (Mondays and Thursdays.) Assist with the 200+ free meals. Preparation (2:00 – 5:00 PM), Packing (4:30 – 6:00 PM), Delivery (4:45 – 5:45 PM), Clean Up (5:45 – 6:45 PM).

Food Rescuers: (Sunday through Friday 1:30 AM and Saturday 9:30 AM.) Volunteers needed to pick up food from Dollar Fresh (Nevada) and transport to Nevada First United Methodist Church.

Food Inventory: (Monday through Friday 11:00 AM - 2:00 PM.) Weigh, sort, and safely store the food donations until distribution to area food pantries can be arranged. Flexible days and hours.

Kindness Calls: (Weekly.) Provide companionship and social contact to older adults through weekly phone calls.

OVERFLOW THRIFT STORE – Ames

North (202 S Duff Ave) & East (919 E Lincoln Way): (Monday through Friday 10:00 AM – 6:00 PM & Saturday 10:00 AM – 4:00 PM.) The North store is looking for help at the register, and to sort, clean, and stock donated merchandise. The East store is looking for volunteers to test donated electronics and tinkering with repairing items.

RAISING READERS OF STORY COUNTY – Ames

Welcome Desk: (Mondays 10:00 AM – 12:00 PM or 12:00 PM – 2:00 PM, Tuesdays 12:00 PM – 2:00 PM, or Wednesdays 10:00 AM – 12:00 PM.) Greet visitors, assist with questions, and maintain welcome desk documents.

REIMAN GARDENS - Ames

Butterfly Wing Docent: (Daily 10:00 AM – 12:00 PM, 12:00 PM – 2:00 PM, or 2:00 PM – 4:30 PM.) Volunteers help monitor the enclosure to ensure regulations are followed, butterflies are contained, and interact with the public.

Food Pantry & Market (Ames): (Monday through Friday 12:30 PM – 3:30 PM.) Fill food boxes to distribute, look over and accept donations, sort and shelve items, deliver packages to neighbors in need. Training will be provided.
